WEEKEND ★ ROUTES

ROUTE NO.1

THE COAST



- 1** Start at the National Museum of the **MIGHTY EIGHTH AIR FORCE** in Pooler where you'll learn about the air war in Europe.
- 2** Next, visit the **WORLD WAR II HOME FRONT MUSEUM** on St. Simons Island and discover the fascinating history of how one small community banded together to do their part during the war.
- 3** A little farther south, you will find the **ST. MARYS SUBMARINE MUSEUM**. Take a deep dive into the history of the submarine force of the U.S. Navy.
- 4** Complete your trip at the **WORLD WAR II FLIGHT TRAINING MUSEUM** in Douglas, the most intact World War II contract pilot training facility in Georgia.

ROUTE NO.2

MIDDLE GEORGIA



- 1** Kick off your adventure in Warner Robins at the **MUSEUM OF AVIATION** to learn more about the Tuskegee Airmen and “jump” with the 507th Parachute Infantry Regiment.
The Museum of Aviation is also the home of the **GEORGIA AVIATION HALL OF FAME** where you can salute the honor, bravery, and lasting impact of Georgia’s most revered aviators.
- 2** About an hour away is the **NATIONAL PRISONER OF WAR MUSEUM** at the Andersonville National Historic Site. Stop in to see displays, artifacts, and oral history interviews featuring POWs, including World War II.
- 3** Travel on to Columbus to visit the world-class **NATIONAL INFANTRY MUSEUM**, home of more than 200 years of United States Army Infantry history.

Start your adventure in Peachtree City, home to the **COMMEMORATIVE AIR FORCE** where you can see fully restored World War II aircraft and even take a flight in one!

Head north into the mountains of northeast Georgia to Toccoa, to visit **CURRAHEE MILITARY MUSEUM**, the training grounds of the 101st Airborne Division - the Band of Brothers.
